Their iron horses transported people, rich tourists from New York, slaves from Africa sold in Havana, and goods from around the state and the globe: oysters, cattle, sugar cane, molasses, and phosphate. Versions of the main lines run today hauling freight in and out of the state and carrying passengers to connecting lines nationwide. Yet Florida's size and shape still get in the way of efficient auto trips and affordable inter-state air travel. A private company is today planning to build a high-speed passenger train from Miami to Orlando. This book is the complete history of railways in the state of Florida, telling the tale of its beginnings as well as its future.
