Still, the fiddle was always dominant. It always remained the heart and soul of his music, and the name Bob Wills became synonymous with fiddle music throughout the Southwest. *

North American Fiddle Music Drew Beisswenger, 2011-05-31 *North American Fiddle Music A Research and Information Guide* is the first large scale annotated bibliography and research guide on the fiddle traditions of the United States and Canada These countries both of which have large immigrant populations as well as Native populations have maintained fiddle traditions that while sometimes faithful to old world or Native styles often feature blended elements from various traditions Therefore researchers of the fiddle traditions in these two countries can not only explore elements of fiddling practices drawn from various regions of the world but also look at how different fiddle traditions can interact and change In addition to including short essays and listings of resources about the full range of fiddle traditions in those two countries it also discusses selected resources about fiddle traditions in other countries that have influenced the traditions in the United States and Canada

Stephanie Sch.,fer, 2012-04 Where I come from it s cornbread and chicken This line from Alan Jackson s country hit defines the genre as the music of the American South All its ambiguity set aside the South stands proudly for its hospitality politeness sense of place and community Family and religion are traditionally more important down there than in the rest of the country As Southern culture becomes more and more americanized and the music of the small town Southern man another Jackson song is adapted for a mainstream audience the original rustic identity that defines the true American genre loses its charm Modern country music has become slick and professionalized and sounds more and more like common pop

music to make it more profitable This study focuses on the authentic country music identity and how it is threatened by increasing commercialization It defines said identity and the working class culture from which it springs It traces the history of country music and its different genres from the 19th and early 20th century cowboy music over Western Swing and Honky Tonk of the 1930s and 1940s the progressive movements of the 1960s and 1970s up to today s mainstream Country Pop and shows how its target audience has changed over time and how the opposition tries to preserve traditional sounds Authentic Texas Country is set in contrast to the commercial Nashville recording industry and both are compared in their respective developments over the years In the face of terrorism which poses a threat to the American National identity country music with its representative American values has become increasingly popular and enforces a strong collective identity on a national level However in doing so it also dilutes the original identity that was once restricted to life in a small town community rather than the country as a whole What sets country music as a genre apart is its narrative structure Every song has a story to tell Be it about The Cold Hard Facts of Life a prayer finally answered or the first kiss on a Saturday night

Ozarks Fiddle Music Drew Beisswenger, 2016-04-19 This book which includes 308 tune transcriptions is organized around individual fiddlers who typically combine Appalachian style fiddling with rags pop standards Midwest style fiddling and sometimes a touch of Western swing to create a style often identifiable as Ozarks Thirty Ozarks fiddlers and their lives are highlighted with biographical sketches photographs and tune histories Another 50 great Ozarks fiddlers are presented in a similar manner but with less detail the book and accompanying CD with 37 tunes many recorded in the field emphasize the older fiddling traditions connected to the square dances and community events more than those connected to bluegrass music and modern contest fiddling Some of the tunes in the collection are old standbys such as Bile Them Cabbage while others such as Finley Creek Blues are unique to the region The book is the result of years of work by two respected researchers Gordon McCann won the prestigious Missouri Arts Award in 2002 for his decades of work documenting studying and accompanying Ozarks fiddle music Drew Beisswenger a music librarian at Missouri State University with a Ph D in ethnomusicology has published three other works about fiddle music and is known for his strong transcription and analysis skills

Boyd, 2010-01-01 They may wear cowboy hats and boots and sing about faded love but western swing musicians have always played jazz From Bob Wills and the Texas Playboys to Asleep at the Wheel western swing performers have played swing jazz on traditional country instruments with all of the required elements of jazz and some of the best solo improvisation ever heard In this book Jean A Boyd explores the origins

and development of western swing as a vibrant current in the mainstream of jazz She focuses in particular on the performers who made the music drawing on personal interviews with some fifty living western swing musicians From pioneers such as Cliff Bruner and Eldon Shamblin to current performers such as Johnny Gimble the musicians make important connections between the big band swing jazz they heard on the radio and the western swing they created and played across the Southwest from Texas to California From this first hand testimony Boyd re creates the world of western swing the dance halls recording studios and live radio shows that broadcast the music to an enthusiastic listening audience Although the performers typically came from the same rural roots that nurtured country music their words make it clear that they considered themselves neither hillbillies nor country pickers but jazz musicians whose performance approach and repertoire were no different from those of mainstream jazz This important aspect of the western swing story has never been told before

Boyd, 2010-01-01 The Light Crust Doughboys are one of the most long lived and musically versatile bands in America Formed in the early 1930s under the sponsorship of Burrus Mill and Elevator Company of Fort Worth Texas with Bob Wills and Milton Brown the originator of western swing at the musical helm and future Texas governor W Lee Pappy O Daniel as band manager and emcee the Doughboys are still going strong in the twenty first century Arguably the quintessential Texas band the Doughboys have performed all the varieties of music that Texans love including folk and fiddle tunes cowboy songs gospel and hymns commercial country songs and popular ballads honky tonk ragtime and blues western swing and jazz minstrel songs movie hits and rock n roll In this book Jean Boyd draws on the memories of Marvin Smokey Montgomery and other longtime band members and supporters to tell the Light Crust Doughboys story from the band s founding in 1931 through the year 2000 She follows the band s musical evolution and personnel over seven decades showing how band members and sponsors responded to changes in Texas culture and musical tastes during the Great Depression World War II and the postwar years Boyd concludes that the Doughboys willingness to change with changing times and to try new sounds and fresh musical approaches is the source of their enduring vitality Historical photographs of the band an annotated discography of their pre World War II work and histories of some of the band s songs round out the volume
