

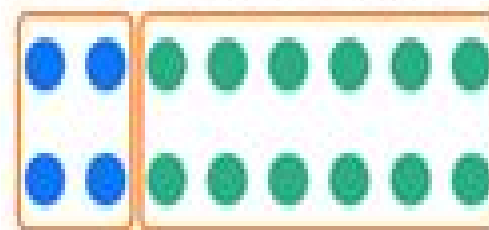
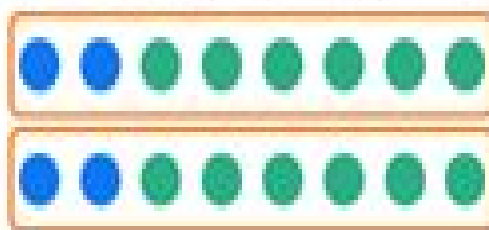
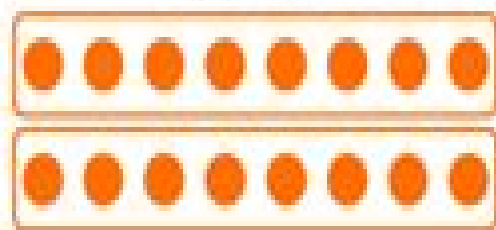
Distributive Property

The **distributive property** states that multiplying the sum of two or more numbers is the same as multiplying the addends separately.

Example

When multiplying 2×8 , you can break 8 up into $2 + 6$.

$$2 \times 8 = 2 \times (2 + 6) = (2 \times 2) + (2 \times 6)$$



Any way you solve the equivalent expressions, the product is the same.

$$2 \times 8 = 16$$

$$2 \times (2 + 6) = 16$$

$$(2 \times 2) + (2 \times 6) = 16$$
